RELIGION

5th Grade:

Students explored Baptism, understanding Christ's roles as priest, prophet, and king, and experiencing new life through him. They learned Baptism's steps and celebration, as well as the liturgical year's seasons, through interactive lessons with games and activities.

6th Grade: Students explored Old Testament stories illustrating God's promises and studied patriarch narratives. They also learned about the liturgical year's seasons through interactive lessons with games and activities.

7th Grade: Students explored Jesus' world, including its geography, religious groups, and lifestyle. They studied his early years, infancy narratives, and roles as priest, prophet, and king. Interactive lessons featured mini-projects and group activities.

8th Grade: Students understood prayer's significance, reflecting on personal practices and valuing communal and personal prayer's role in the church. They explored service and unity, recognizing the importance of using their unique gifts and being united in spirit. Interactive lessons included mini-projects and group activities.
